About Us

Hutton Cranswick Playgroup was established in 1969 in the Methodist Hall in Cranswick and we are still here today! Over the years we have seen many changes and have grown and developed to provide sessions for children aged two to five years, in line with the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) framework.



In October 2017 Playgroup achieved a good report from the Government's Office for Standards in Education, Children's Services and Skills (Ofsted).

Hutton Cranswick Playgroup is a registered charity - Registered Charity Number 1034331 - run by trustees who are elected every year at the Annual General Meeting. The trustees are responsible for decision making, fundraising and adhering to Ofsted policies. In addition we have a fundraising committee who organise events to raise much needed funds.

We are a member of the Early Years Alliance and all of our team attend regular training sessions to keep them fully up to date with childcare and education issues. They also all attend paediatric first aid training every three years.



Our Early Years Educators

Here at Hutton Cranswick Playgroup we have a team of qualified, dedicated experienced early years educators who are responsible for the day to day running of the Playgroup. They do a wonderful job of planning a varied curriculum as well as caring for all children who attend the sessions.



We passionately believe that we are a welcoming playgroup and a vital part of our village. We work hard in fostering great community spirit. Our children regularly visit the Tuesday afternoon pop in at the W.I. Hall to share their baking or entertain with the latest songs they have learnt. Every year the children work together to create a Remembrance Day poppy and place it at the village war memorial. They donate items for St Peter's Church's 'Love in a shoebox' appeal and pack the shoeboxes themselves. We are great supporters of Village in Bloom and enter the Yorkshire in Bloom young people's awards, achieving a gold in our category in 2019.



Our Early Years Educators have developed good relationships with the team at Hutton Cranswick C.P. School and work together to ensure smooth transitions. The children attend each other's Christmas plays and we take the opportunity to visit the school setting when possible; an example being pre-school children visiting the newly hatched chicks in the Reception Class.

Our aim is to provide a warm and caring environment in which your child is offered stimulating experiences through play and is encouraged to develop their imagination, creativity and independence. It is also our hope that friendships will develop and that your child will feel trusting and secure within the Playgroup setting.

What We Offer

Playgroup operates during term time only and follows very similar terms to Hutton Cranswick Community Primary School.

We offer up to 30 hours of Early Years sessions each week, Monday to Friday.

We offer sessions for children from 2 years old until school age.

Playgroup's sessions:

Monday to Friday	Full day: 9.00am - 3.00pm (2 sessions / 6 hours) Morning: 9.00am - 12.00pm (1 session / 3 hours) Afternoon: 12:00pm - 3.00pm (1 session / 3 hours)
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Our sessions are planned so that the children can choose from a range of fun and stimulating activities to encourage their independence and build confidence in their abilities. The children are also helped and encouraged to take part in adult-led small and larger group activities which introduce them to new experiences and help them gain new skills, as well as helping them to learn to work with others. We give time and attention to each child and talk with them about their interests and activities. We encourage the children in our care to explore their interests and be adventurous safely.

The children enjoy a wide range of role play and small world resources. They often get the chance to cook and bake. Painting is an ever popular activity and the book corner is well loved, be it reading alone or sharing a story with a friend, adult, in a small or large group. Our remote controlled talking turtles create great excitement amongst all the children and are their first steps to learn coding!

Outdoor Space

Outdoor activities contribute to children's health, their physical development and their knowledge of the world around them. The children have the opportunity, and are encouraged, to take part in outdoor child chosen and adult-led activities.

Our garden has all-weather artificial grass so it is accessible all year round and with its mud kitchen, water area, caterpillar and sand pit, it is a firm favourite with our children. They all enjoy tending to the raised beds in the garden throughout the year, delightedly watching the seeds they have planted growing.

We also have a range of scooters, tricycles and ride-on toys for the children to use.



Snacks

Part way through each session the children have a drink and a snack. Fruit and other healthy options are provided by Playgroup and milk is provided through the government's Nursery Milk Scheme.

Lunches

In the full day sessions children have the opportunity to stay for their lunch. This is a packed lunch provided by yourselves and we encourage this to be healthy and nutritious. The main benefit of this is that the children are prepared for when they start school and are used to eating in a group setting under adult supervision.



Dropping off and collecting your child

When dropping off and collecting your child we ask that you wait in the hallway area until a member of our team opens the main door.

We would ask that you give written notification if you would like your child to be collected by anyone other than yourself. This is a legal requirement and ensures your child's absolute safety. Forms are available from Playgroup.

Discipline

We aim to have a positive approach to behaviour, whereby acceptable patterns of good behaviour are made clear and rewarded. However, if a child is disruptive or endangers themselves or other children by their behaviour they will be verbally corrected.





Illness and Safety

In your child's own best interests and for the well being of other children and our educators, we ask you not to bring your child into Playgroup if they are obviously unwell or have any infection. We ask you to inform Playgroup as to the nature of the infection so that we can alert other parents and make careful observations of any child who seems unwell.

If a child is taken ill whilst at Playgroup, parents / carers will be contacted to request that arrangements are made for the child to be collected early. For the benefit of all at Playgroup we have a comprehensive illness in playgroup policy which is included in your Registration Pack. We ask that you read it carefully and abide by the regulations.

We aim to provide a safe and secure environment for your child to develop and learn in. We ensure that all of our early years educators have Level 3 paediatric first aid training and a correctly stocked first aid box is available at all times on the premises. Parents will be informed at the end of each session of any minor bumps or falls. Accidents logged in the accident book will require a parent/carer signature and a follow up from a member of our team.

Policies and Procedures

At Hutton Cranswick Playgroup, we review our policies and procedures regularly. These ensure that the service provided by us is of a high standard and that we follow guidelines set by Ofsted, Early Years Foundation Stage framework, the Local Authority and Early Years Alliance.

The policies ensure both the safety of your child and the effective management of Playgroup. These policies cover administration, equal opportunities, parental partnership, record keeping, safeguarding children and health and safety. You will be given online access to read any of our policies, when your child starts.

Registering

If you are interested in your child attending playgroup sessions, please email hello@huttoncranswickplaygroup.co.uk. Alternatively you can call the Playgroup mobile 07749 897 441 and leave a message with your details. We will be in touch to discuss your needs and arrange for you to visit.

If you decide that you would like your child to attend, you will be given a Registration Pack with forms to complete. We will ask for some essential information in order to meet social services requirements. More importantly though, the information you give will help tremendously in case of emergencies. The forms must be given back to Playgroup before your child's first Playgroup session. All personal data given will be kept in confidence and used in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulation. A one off fee of £5 will be added to your first bill to cover the administration cost.

Fees

Our fees are calculated per three hour session, so a morning or afternoon counts as one session and a full day counts as two sessions. For our current session fees, please contact us.

We can offer up to 30 hours of early years education per week (term time only). This can be paid for through your funded entitlement (when eligible), or fees, or a combination of both. We are registered with the government's tax-free childcare scheme and also accept payment from a range of other childcare voucher schemes. Please ask if you need more information.

We can offer sessions for those eligible for 15 hours per week of 2 year old funding as well as the statutory 15 hours of funding, which your child automatically receives the term *after* their third birthday. We can offer up to 30 funded hours per week for those who are eligible for the additional funding entitlement.

You will receive a bill from us at the beginning of each half term for fees due. We ask that these fees be paid by the end of that term in order for us to cover our basic expenses. We have a late payment policy (details in your registration pack). Full payment will still be required if your child cannot attend Playgroup (for example due to a holiday in term time or illness), as we must honour our commitments to paying rent, salaries and insurance.

We are open for 39 weeks of the year, in line with the academic school year. If you use early years funding, please be aware that this only pays for 38 weeks of the year, so you will receive a bill for the last week of the academic year in July.

Your Questions Answered



The questions below are those most frequently asked by new parents. We hope the answers will be helpful to you but please don't hesitate to contact us should you have any other queries.

What should my child wear?

It is important that your child is comfortable. In order to feel free to explore and experiment with all kinds of materials, including messy ones, it is best to send your child dressed in clothes that are easily washed and not too precious! Sweatshirts and t-shirts with the Playgroup logo of 'Puddle Bear' are available to buy from H&K Embroidery in Driffield, but are completely optional. Please remember to write your child's name on their clothing, especially if they have a Playgroup top.

How can I help my child settle in?

We understand that each child is unique and know children tend to learn better when they are happy; a child who is tense or unhappy will not be able to play or learn properly. It is important for parents and educators to work together to help the child feel confident and secure within the group. We do take care to gather lots of information when your child joins us, for example asking about close friends and family members, favourite toys and activities, which gives us the opportunity to talk about familiar things and hopefully make your child feel comfortable. Settling in can take longer for some children than for others and you should not feel worried if your child takes a while. Our educators are always available to talk to if you have any concerns.

Can my child bring their own toys in?

It would help us if children were discouraged from bringing their own toys to Playgroup, unless your child needs a special teddy or comforter to help in the settling in process. When a child brings their own toy to Playgroup it may upset another child if they are not allowed to play with it or your child may not want anyone else to touch it.

What if I need to make changes to my child's attendance?

If you would like to increase your child's sessions and pay fees, you can do so at any time (subject to a space being available). For funded sessions, you can change your child's sessions at the start of each funding period. Please ask if you need more information. If you need to reduce your child's sessions, please let us know a half term in advance. Failure to do so may incur charges for sessions your child no longer attends.

Who do I talk to about a problem?

Our early years educators are always available and ready to listen to any problem you may have concerning your child. We especially appreciate any information that might affect your child's well-being or behaviour in Playgroup.

How is my child's progress observed and recorded?

We use the Early Years Foundation Stage framework as a base for planning and observation within the setting. We have a key worker system and you will be notified who your child's key worker is when they start Playgroup. Your child will also have a Tapestry Learning Journey during their time at Playgroup. This is a secure electronic system that allows Playgroup to show your child's development in each of the Early Years areas of learning. It is also a great way to keep you up to date with what your child has been doing at Playgroup!

What happens when it is time to move on to school?

We have a good links with Hutton Cranswick Community Primary School. We make the most of opportunities to visit each other's settings, for example watching each other's Nativity plays. In the summer term, the school staff visit the children who will be moving up to school and the children have introductory visits to the school, one of which is accompanied by the Playgroup team. We have transition meetings with the school staff to discuss key information. All of this helps to ensure starting school is a natural progression. If your child is going to attend a different school, the Playgroup team will work with that school in a very similar way, to ensure that your child's progression is as smooth as possible.

What is the procedure if I have a complaint?

If you have any concerns or issues that you would like to be addressed, please speak to any of the team of early years educators in the first instance and they will do all they can to find a solution. If you wish to complain about any aspect of Hutton Cranswick Playgroup, please do so in writing via the Chairperson, Secretary or Treasurer. We would hope to resolve the matter immediately.
